Preserving future fertility with sperm banking



A paper (in press) from our on-site licensed and accredited sperm bank, New York Cryo, has demonstrated that semen quality of patients with cancer did not differ significantly from men without cancer. In our study less than 10% of newly diagnosed men with cancer had severely impaired sperm quality. This included hospitalized men who were critically ill and needed urgent chemotherapy.

Our work supports the need to encourage sperm banking for all men as soon as they are diagnosed with cancer. Sperm banking done prior to initiation of therapy can help preserve future fertility.

Rapid Ejaculation and Urethritis Trials Underway

Rapid ejaculation is one of the most common forms of sexual dysfunction in men. Latest research indicates that over 40% of American men are affected. Typically, orgasm and ejaculation occur with minimal sexual stimulation before, on, or shortly after vaginal penetration and before the patient might wish. In addition rapid ejaculation causes a man or his partner significant distress and/or difficulty.

Non-gonococcal urethritis is most common in men between the ages of 18 and 45. It is also the most common sexually transmitted disease among couples of reproductive ages and often responsible for both male and female infertility.

And Cialis® makes three!



With the recent FDA approval of Cialis® there are now three oral medications available for men with erectile dysfunction...Viagra®, Levitra® and Cialis®. All three drugs work in the same way. They maintain the dilation of blood vessels in the penis by inhibiting a key enzyme. Cialis® differs from the other two by reportably having a shorter onset of action (20 minutes instead of 40 minutes) and a longer duration of effectiveness (36 hours instead of 4 hours). Follow up studies are needed to validate these results and assure the safety of this new medication.
